Guide to the Ohio Power Siting Board Utility Scale Solar Farm Resources

The Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB) was established in 1972 to guide the development of major energy infrastructure projects based on public need, environmental implications, land use considerations and economic impact. Before constructing a major utility facility in Ohio, developers must acquire a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need from the OPSB. The OPSB has jurisdiction over electric generation facilities of 50 megawatts (MW) or more, including solar; electric transmission lines and associated facilities of 100 kilovolts or more; economically significant wind farms; and gas pipelines longer than 500 feet with an outside diameter greater than 9 inches designed for transporting gas at a maximum operating pressure in excess of 125 pounds per square inch.

The OPSB publishes a monthly *Solar Farm Map and Statistics* report. The report provides a map with locations and the status of utility scale solar farms before the OPSB. Steps to download the OPSB monthly *Solar Farm Map and Statistics* report and investigate details of a specific project are provided below.

- Step 1: Go to the OPSB Solar Farm Map and Statistics website. To find this website you can open a web browser and search "OPSB solar" or you can copy and paste the direct URL listed below.

- Step 2: As illustrated in Image A, scroll to the bottom right section of the webpage and click download button.
- Step 3: The first few pages use a series of maps to summarize the current projects submitted to the OPSB for review. To investigate a specific project, scroll to the table located towards the end of the report and identify the project that you are interested in gathering additional details. As illustrated in Image B, click on the case record number in the left hand column to view public records for that project.

- Step 4: From the main "Case Record" page, you can view formal applications, staff reports, project technical studies, and other filings submitted to the OPSB. In addition, you can review public comments, identify key parties of record for the case, and file a public comment online for the case record (Image C).
- Step 5: If you are only interested in projects near your community, you can conduct a simple search to filter projects by county.
 From the OPSB homepage (www.OPSB.ohio.gov) select "Cases" from the top menu bar (Image D).
- Step 6: From the cases search page you can find information about approved, operational, pending and pre-application cases in your county. In the advanced filter section, place your cursor in the filter "By County" box and select your county from the drop down options (Image E). If you scroll to the bottom of the page, all of the active projects in that county will be displayed by project name and case record number listed in individual boxes. Click on the project box you are interested in to get additional details.
 - (Note: you can also filter by county by typing the name of your county in the "Search by Keyword" filter)

Image C: Case Record Main Page




Image D: OPSB Home Page





Image E: Cases Search Page





• Step 6: From the case record summary page (Image F), you can click "Open Case Record" to access public documents such as formal applications, staff reports, project technical studies, and other filings submitted to the OPSB. In addition, you can select the link towards the bottom center of the page to learn specific details about the OPSB application process and ways to stay informed to make your voice heard at the OPSB through public participation. Finally, at any point, you can use the help button located in the lower right hand side of the webpage to file a public comment, contact the OPSB staff, or go to the OPSB help center.




Image F: Case Record Summary Page
